On April 9th and 10th we can change the world. Don't laugh. Don't listen to that cynical voice that says, "Impossible! What can be done about AIDS and poverty and food insecurity and underdevelopment?" **On April 9th and 10th we can change the world.**

There are 9 villages near Blantyre in Malawi, Africa without clean water. Villagers walk hours to reach useable wells and hours back home carrying barely enough for one day's drinking and cooking. What if these 9 villages had seven or eight functioning wells? Think of the time and labor saved, the opportunities for work and parenting and education opened up. **On April 9th and 10th we can change the world.**

That weekend begins a new relationship between our church, our community and 9 amazing villages in Malawi. With your help I believe we can solve their water problem in one weekend, raising enough resources to allow them to build their own wells at \$1,000 to \$1,500 apiece. A community 5K run and our African festival at Huddy Park will draw members of our community and we'll distribute bottles of "dirty water" (actually iced tea) that can be drunk and filled with coins.

On this *FaithWorks Weekend*, just two weeks before Easter, PCTR is cancelling our 4 worship services! No *services*, just *Service*. We'll feed meals to Interfaith and Hope Center friends, do

home clean ups and repairs and there will be jobs for everyone of every age, both before and during the weekend.

On April 9th and 10th we can change the world. A new relationship will begin between the vital believers in Malawi and the disciples of PCTR. A new partnership starts between Africa and Toms River. A new tradition begins at our church of showing the world that "love" is a verb. Pray for it. Anticipate it. **On April 9th and 10th we WILL change the world.**

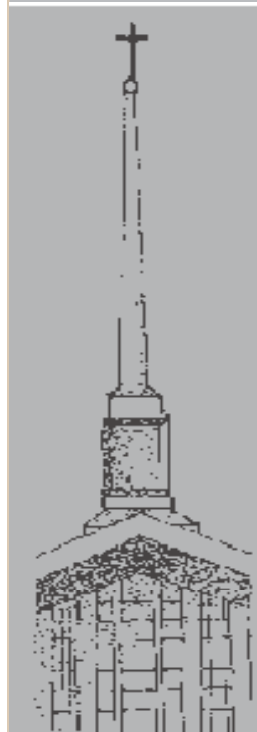

***Remember When You Thought
You could change the world?
You still can!***

These are difficult days in our world's history. 1.75 billion people are desperately poor, natural disasters are gouging entire nations, and economic uncertainty still reigns across the globe. But you and I have been given an opportunity to make a big difference.

What if we did? What if we rocked the world with hope? Infiltrated all corners with God's love and life? We are created by a great God to do great works. He invites us to outlive our lives, not just in heaven, but here on earth.

It's not enough to do well. We want to do good. We want our lives to matter. So, let's live our lives in such a way that the world will be glad we did.

During our Lenten Series we will use the book "***Outlive Your Life***" written by Max Lucado. The ***Outlive Your Life*** Study will challenge you to get off your knees, roll up your sleeves and start serving God in practical ways. Max uses the early church in the Book of Acts as a blueprint for how to impact your world for Christ.

Our Lenten Series begins on Ash Wednesday, March 9th and continues each Wednesday through April 13th. Our schedule is as follows:

- 5:30-6:30 – Dinner in Fellowship Hall
- 6:30-7:00 – Worship in the Sanctuary
- 7:00-8:30 – Small group study and discussion time using Max Lucado's "Outlive Your Life" series

The price for dinner if paid in advance will be \$7.00 for Adults, \$4.00 for children under 12 and \$16 for a family. At the door the price will be \$10.00 for adults and \$20.00 for a family.

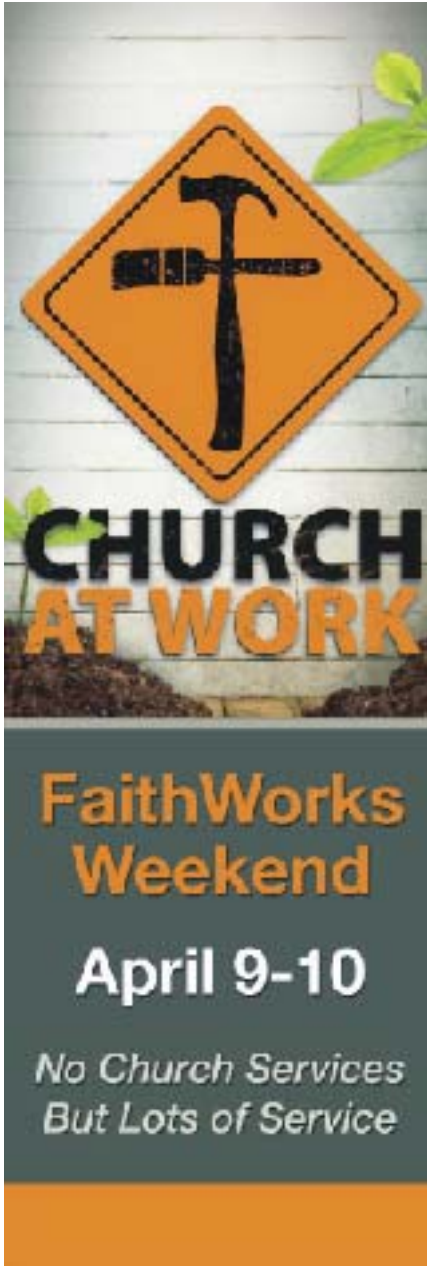
